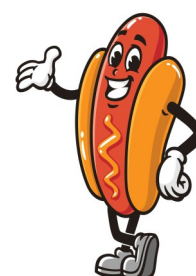

2026 Banquet Hall Rental

Banquet Hall Rental & Use Conditions:

1. The term of your hall rental agreement is for up to 6 hours of event time, 2 hours of set-up time and 1 hour of clean up time **for a total 9 hours (bar service ends at 12:30 a.m.)**. If there is conflict with other events, any limitations to this time will be provided to you by Fallen Timbers prior to your contract signing. If additional time is required, approval must be provided for by Fallen Timbers Fairways. **The hall rental fee with an estimation of the number of attendee's is due at the time of contract signing in order for your date to be booked and held.**
2. All food & beverages will be provided for by Fallen Timbers Fairways. Ohio law prohibits alcohol and/or food brought onto a licensed premise. All aspects of food and beverage service will be provided for by Fallen Timbers Fairways. Fallen Timbers will always monitor consumption and retains the right to limit or refuse service as necessary.
3. All food pricing will be held firm 3 month in advance of your event, cost adjustment may be required for quotes longer than 3 months based upon unstable food cost. The rental provides for the banquet hall exclusively, access to the restrooms & the bar and porch areas, and for the benefit of your group and others that may be seasonally attending. Tables, chairs and coverings will provide for 120 personas in the hall and the shared bar area holds 24 person seating. Addition tables and chars and linins-if desired, will be the responsibility of the event host.
4. Fallen Timbers has an internal sound system for music and microphone use. All other aspect including but not limited to DJ's, dance floors, projectors, podiums, table center pieces and decorations will be at the sole expense of the event host. **Confetti & wall hangings are prohibited!** A complete understanding of what you wish and what we will provide will be better for all parties if they are discussed and understood in advance!

Beverage/Bar Service Options:

Fallen Timbers provides a full service bar including soft drinks, coffee, beer wine and spiritous liquor Monday through Saturday until 12:30 a.m. Sunday service for beer, wine and soft beverages is available-BUT CANNOT INCLUDE SPIRIOUTS LIQUOR!

Banquets and outings may opt for a variety of beverage service including the following:

- ◆ **Cash Bar;** where your guest simply pay for their beverages as they go.
- ◆ **Open Bar;** as the host, you may allow your guests to receive beverages for a limited period of time or for the duration of your event based upon you pre-arrange agreement for payment with Fallen Timbers. This can be for all beverage options or limited to specific selection like domestic beer & wine.
- ◆ **Tickets;** you, as the host, may purchase tickets from Fallen Timbers, that your guest may redeem for any or pre-authorized beverages during the time of your function.
- ◆ **Keg Purchase Option;** The pre-purchase a keg or kegs for the specific use for your function my be provided for. The costs vary based on the selection of beer you choose.
- ◆ **Open Soft Beverage Option:** A flat rate option, based upon the number of guest at your function may be provided for. This would include fountain beverages and coffee.

No outside food may be brought onto the premise's pursuant to Ohio/Lucas Co. Health Department Codes. . NO Beer/Wine or Alcohol may be brought onto the premises pursuant to Ohio State Liquor Licensing Laws. Fallen Timbers will always monitor consumption and retains the right to limit or refuse service as necessary.

Fallen Timbers, The Battle!

The Battle of Timbers, on August 20, 1794, was the last major conflict of the Northwest Territory Indian War between Native Americans and the United States. At the battle, near present-day Toledo, Ohio, General Anthony Wayne (1745-96) led U.S. troops to victory over a confederation of Indian warriors whose leaders included Chief Blue Jacket of the Shawnees and Chief Little Turtle of the Miami's. The Treaty of Greenville, signed the following year, opened up much of present-day Ohio to white settlers.

Although the 1783 [Treaty of Paris](#), which ended the American Revolutionary War (1775-83), ceded control of the Northwest Territory (the land northwest of the **Ohio** River) to the United States, the British failed to abandon their forts in the region and continued to support their Indian allies in skirmishes with American settlers.

Prior to the Battle of Timbers, two earlier American military expeditions into the Northwest Territory by generals Josiah Harmer and Arthur St. Clair in 1790 and 1791, respectively, failed to end the unrest. In fact, St. Clair's effort at the Battle of the Wabash concluded with an Indian victory and heavy U.S. troop losses. In 1792, President George Washington (1732-99) appointed General Anthony Wayne commander of the Legion of the United States, a new professional army.

During the Revolutionary War, Wayne, a Pennsylvania native, had earned the moniker "Mad Anthony" for his bold and successful storming of a British fort at the Battle of Stony Point, New York, in 1779. Much of Wayne's subsequent career involved divesting Native Americans of their land. After helping lead the Americans to victory at the 1781 Battle of Yorktown, Virginia, the last major conflict of the Revolutionary War, Wayne traveled to Georgia, where he negotiated treaties with the Creeks and Cherokees. They paid dearly in land for their decision to side with the British during the Revolutionary War, and Georgia officials paid Wayne in land, giving him a large plantation, for his efforts on their behalf.

Battle of Fallen Timbers: August 20, 1794

At the Battle of Fallen Timbers, on August 20, 1794, Wayne led American troops to a decisive victory against a confederation of Native Americans whose leaders included Chief Little Turtle (Miami), Chief Blue Jacket (Shawnee) and Chief Buckongahelas (Lenape). The fighting took place on the Maumee River, near present-day Toledo.

With the Treaty of Greenville, signed in present-day Greenville, Ohio, in August 1795, the Indians ceded much of present-day Ohio, which, in 1803, became America's 17th state. By the terms of the treaty, the Indians also ceded parts of Indiana, Illinois and Michigan.
